Dianne Campbell: Dianne passed away Thursday morning at the Mahaska Health Partnership Hospice Services Serenity House in Oskaloosa at the age of 82 years, 5 months and 1 day. She was a 1948 graduate of Oskaloosa High School and then attended Monticello College where she studied art and graduated in 1950. She attended the University of Iowa from 1950 to 1951 where she was a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority. Dianne was united in marriage to John Louis Campbell in Oskaloosa, Iowa on

July 14, 1951. Dianne was an accomplished artist. She learned from well-known artist, Dwight Kirsch and assisted him in the design and painting of the mural located in the former Mahaska State Bank in Oskaloosa. As a member of the Barnhouse family, she truly enjoyed music, especially singing and playing the guitar. She was a regular listener at the Oskaloosa Bandstand on Thursday nights. Dianne was a life-long member of St. James Episcopal Church where she was active in the Altar Guild. She also served her community as a volunteer with the Ecumenical Cupboard, End of the Month Meals, and the Y Community Center. In addition to her parents and her husband, John, Dianne was preceded in death by two brothers, Chuck and Bob Barnhouse, and a sister, Cynthia Coe.
