Grace Poe, 72, of Oskaloosa passed away, Saturday morning, October 31, 2015, at the MHP Hospice Services Serenity House in Oskaloosa.

Grace Ann Poe, daughter of Clyde and Rosa (Kersey) Beaver, was born January 6, 1942, in Iowa City, Iowa. Grace was raised in the Harvey/Durham area and attended Knoxville High School. She worked at Oskaloosa Produce until her marriage to Dwayne Poe, December 23, 1960, in Harvey, Iowa. Grace and Dwayne lived in the Eddyville and Red Rock area before making their home in Oskaloosa in 1967. She and Dwayne were blessed with three sons. She was also mother to her eldest granddaughter, MaKayla Poe. Grace's purest desire and calling in life was to support her husband Dwayne in his ministry; they were a team in every way.
