Harold I. Scott: Harold passed away Tuesday evening, August 7, 2012, at the MHP Hospice Services Serenity House in Oskaloosa at the age of 93 years, 7 months and 1 day.

He married Phyllis Arlene Grubb, December 14, 1941, in Lancaster, MO. He and Phyllis farmed in Jefferson and West Des Moines Townships over the years. Harold moved into Oskaloosa in 2006, but continued to help his son with their farming operations until recently. Harold's passion was farming, but he also

took the time to enjoy hunting, fishing and talking on his C.B. radio.

In addition to his parents, Harold was preceded in death by his wife Phyllis on January 25, 2002; a daughter, Judy Chamra; four brothers: Oren, John, Herman, and Homer Scott, and four sisters: Fern Littlejohn, LaVonne Brown, Florence Sloan and Marie Littlejohn.
