John Ross Mattix: John passed away Monday evening at the Mahaska Hospital.

In John's early career he held a number of truck driving positions, driving for Ready-Mix and also driving as a gasoline transporter. From 1969 until his retirement in 1987, he owned and operated the Union Tavern in Oskaloosa. John enjoyed truck driving, fishing, mushroom hunting, shooting pool and horseshoe throwing. John was an avid Cubs fan, loved his dog - Lamar, and

most of all, spending time with his family. He was a member of The American Legion in Oskaloosa.
