Marjorie Mae Tucker, 92, died Thursday, January 16, 2025, at the Oskaloosa Care Center in Oskaloosa, Iowa.

Marjorie was born in Pershing, Iowa, to Jonas "Bubber" Gott and Edna Mae Fry Gott into a coal mining family. Her dad was killed in a mining accident when she was a young girl. Her mother remarried, and she was raised by her mom and stepdad, Ernest Moses. She graduated from Oskaloosa High School with the class of 1950. Following high school, she worked in retail and was united in marriage to Frederick Dale Tucker on April 16, 1951. They moved to University Park in 1960 and took pride in the community, including volunteering in the construction of the community center.

Her family includes three sons: Stephen (Lisa) Tucker of Oskaloosa, Brian (Flo) Tucker of Pensacola, Florida, and Michael (Laura) Tucker of Phoenix, Arizona, 12 grandchildren and 26 great-grandchildren. She is also survived by a brother, Richard of Texas, and a sister, Debbie of Lynnville, Iowa. She was preceded in death by her parents and brothers, Phillip, Terry, Raymond, and Ernest, as well as sisters Linda, Evelyn Kay, and Martha.

Marjorie was proud of protesting school consolidation and cutting down trees for road widening, but "Grandma Marge" was most proud of her children and grandchildren. Dale and Marge were fixtures at Oskaloosa sporting events, both home and away. In her later years, she also enjoyed mixed-league bowling.

The family would like to thank the staff of Oskaloosa Care Center for the

excellent care she received the last three and half years.

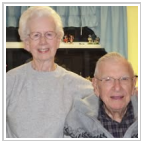
